


Meeting and working spaces


- Non-profit groups or organizations, community groups or governmental

- Study rooms but currently under construction






Workshops Hosted by HPL


- Program Department to teach beginner program on entrepreneurship in May

 - Teach organizations how to use data visualization and impact storytelling to strengthen grant applications.













Library on Wheels

- The Library on Wheels brings literature, resources, and a sense of community to all neighborhoods. They connect residents to their nearest HPL branch and to provide services for those who do not have convenient access to a library in their neighborhood.
- Visits are conducted to community locations such as senior centers, farmers markets, schools, literacy events, and more. The Library on Wheels attends community events by request while being open to partnerships with community organizations for biweekly, monthly, or yearly visits.
 - Library card registration (as eligible)
 - Programming (in collaboration with host)
 - Access to Library books (adult and children's collection in several languages)
 - Free materials (collection removed books, etc. when available)
 - Information on library events, resources, and services
 - Other library materials

Access to Candid databases (Foundation Directory, Guidestar)

- Must access through the library's website

- GuideStar supplies extensive data, including financial, on nonprofit organizations
