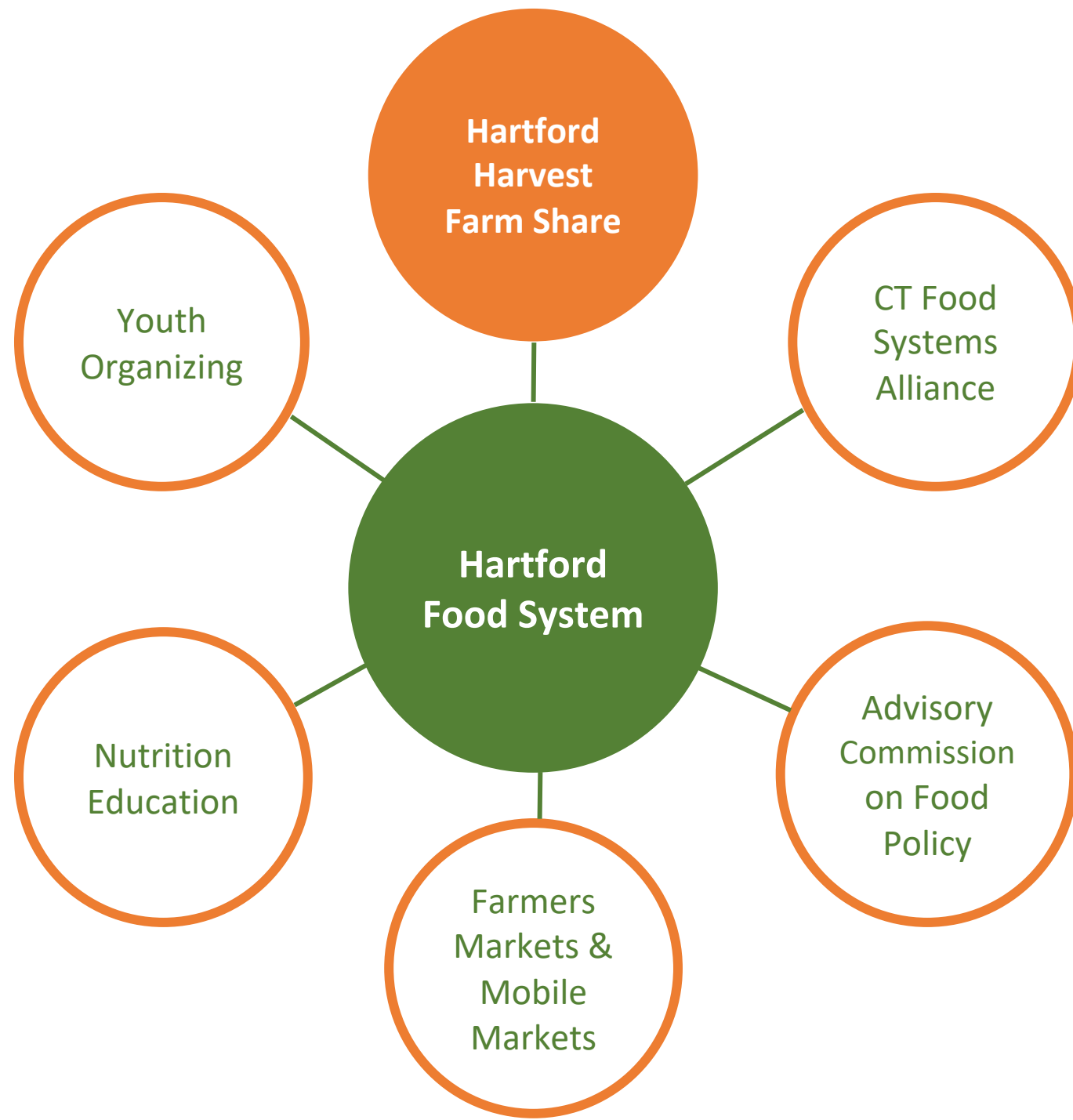

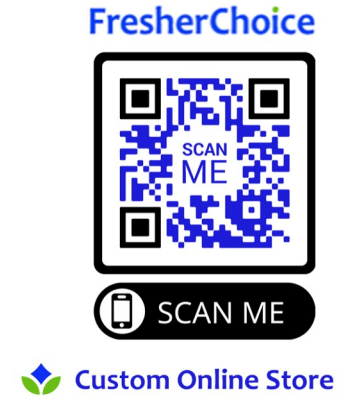

Our 2022 Pilot Season

- 18 weeks of fresh local produce from Hartford area farms
- Aggregate seasonal produce – both fruits and vegetables
- Approximately 30 participants are enrolled

Our Market Segment

- 12,000 Hartford households \geq \$75K annual income
- 8,050 households in North End \leq ALICE annual income
- 34,000 households in inner ring Hartford suburbs



Our Key Customers

- 54% of participants are from Hartford proper
 - 46% are ALICE households
